Meeting called to order by Mayor Prichard.

Robert Seymour said that the D.O.T. has informed him the City will start being charged for sand and salt. Bob said he would have to drive to Indianola and have the truck weighed so they know how much we are receiving. There was discussion regarding the discount the D.O.T. receives on their water-sewer utility bill due the City not paying in the past. There was discussion on the amount of water the D.O.T. is currently using to make brine compared to when that station first opened and how much more of an area they are now treating. The city clerk will contact Osceola and Knoxville to see how much they charge the D.O.T. for their water and sewer utilities.

Fire Report: Chief Henson stated they had 13 EMS calls and 2 fire calls. He stated they also completed re-certification of the Lucas Device, which does CPR compressions.

They was discussion regarding purchasing a new electronic sign since the City's has now broke. S. Henson made a motion to purchase a new sign up to \$400.00; seconded by R. Baker. On a roll call vote: Henson, Aye; Berger, Aye; Baker, Aye. Mayor Prichard declared the motion carried unanimously.

There was discussion regarding payment for supplies, bills and other items that may need to be purchased in between meetings. The city attorney stated that the law requires council approval before any payments can be made. If any bills come in that were in the Resolution adopted, those can be automatically paid and placed on the disbursement report.

Resolution 12-2-2019-1 Approving the Form and Acceptance of 28E agreement for Mutual Aid was presented. Whereas, the City Council of Martensdale has received a copy of the 28E Agreement for Mutual Assistance between the City of Martensdale and the respective counties and representative municipalities, to wit: Norwalk, Iowa; Indianola, Iowa; West Des Moines, Iowa; and Madison County, Iowa, regarding such services and generally further described as: Fire/Rescue Services and Mutual Aid and Emergency Medical Services and Mutual Aid. The City of Norwalk 28E agreement was presented. R. Baker made a motion to approve Resolution 12-2-2019-1 with the City of Norwalk 28E agreement; seconded by T. Berger. On a roll call vote: Henson, Aye; Berger, Aye; Baker, Aye. Mayor Prichard declared the motion carried unanimously.

There was discussion about having another meeting with one of the job applicants for the maintenance position. The Mayor and city council asked the city clerk to see if the applicant could meet on Dec. 9, 2019 at 3:30 and then have a closed session at 5:30 with the applicant. The city clerk will contact the applicant.

There was discussion about items that the fire dept. needed to purchase. The fire dept. would like to purchase adapters and helmet supplies for approximately \$2,700.00; and the rescue dept. needs to purchase \$1,000.00 in medical supplies. R. Baker made a motion to approve the purchases; seconded by T. Berger. On a roll call vote: Henson, Aye; Berger, Aye; Baker, Aye. Mayor Prichard declared the motion carried unanimously.

The fire dept. computer needs to be replaced since it is no longer working. The software will also need to be updated. T. Berger made a motion to purchase a new computer and software up to \$3,500.00; seconded by R. Baker. On a roll call vote: Henson, Aye; Berger, Aye; Baker, Aye. Mayor Prichard declared the motion carried unanimously.

There was discussion on sending an individual to a EMT basic certification class at Mercy College, cost is \$900.00. R. Baker made a motion to approve the EMT certification class; seconded by T. Berger. On a roll call vote: Henson, Aye; Berger, Aye; Baker, Aye. Mayor Prichard declared the motion carried unanimously.

There was discussion about Mayor Prichard and Scott Henson attend the Jan. 2020 Warren Water Board Meeting with Mike from the Martensdale D.O.T. facility to discuss updating the water pit options.

Santa Claus will be at the fire station on Dec. 22nd from 5:00-6:00 p.m.

The city clerk stated that all incoming city council members have been sworn in to perform their duties on Jan. 1, 2020.

Jan. 6, 2020 was set as the next city council meeting.
